Following the presentation on bonding capacity and tax rate, the following questions were discussed at the individual tables.

1) What's the impact to our community?

POSITIVES:

- New facilities.
- More opportunities for students.
- Attract new businesses and people to move to Gainesville.
- The possibility that some of the students who transfer out will return to GISD.

CONCERNS:

- Increase in taxes.
- Homeowners will feel the biggest impact of the tax increase.
- Impact on stakeholders that own many rental properties within the district.
- Bond will need to be for a larger amount than previous bonds due to the facility needs incurred since the last bond election in 2005.
- Previous bond failures
- Previous bond elections; low voter turnout and close election results
- Requesting anything over 50 million will be too much.
- Perceptions of the community
- Getting correct information out to stakeholders.
- How to get stakeholders that no longer have students in school on board.
- Stakeholders that are transferring their children to other schools will automatically vote no.
- Although the district has continued to lower tax rate, property values are increasing.
- Will projected growth estimates be correct.
- 2) What additional questions do you have? No additional questions were asked by committee members.

- 7) Safety Entryways Total Points – 37
